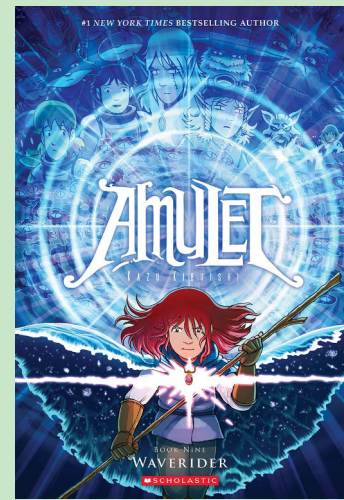
Enemies-to-lovers doesn't get more high stakes than a witch and a witch hunter falling in love.

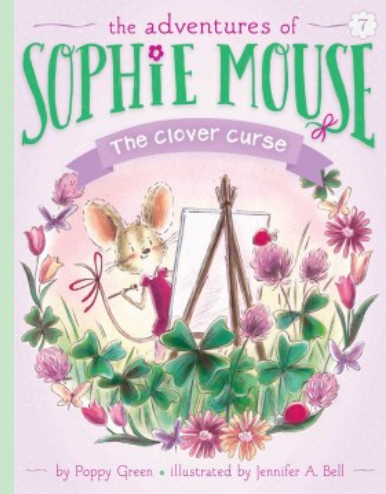


Sequel to *The Stolen Heir*
