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Where to Start

What can you do to get your child off to a good start as a reader?

1. Talk to them. About anything! Talk, listen, answer questions. Having day-to-day conversations with children increases the words they hear, the vocabulary they come to understand.
2. Read to them. Introduce your child to pre-reading skills: the correct orientation of letters, books are read from left to right, top to bottom. Use your finger to track the words. Teach them that words on the page convey a message or relate to the pictures.
3. Play with them. Use play-based activities to increase vocabulary and oral language. Use word games to teach them about rhyming, letter-sounds, and the alphabet.

4. Enjoy #1-3. If you are enthusiastic and enjoy these activities, you create excitement for your child.

Phonological Awareness Hearing and understanding that that words are made up of smaller sounds.

To create this awareness:

- Sing songs and rhymes
- Count syllables
- Break words down into individual sounds
- Substitute one letter sound for another one to make a new word



Children's academic successes at ages 9 and 10 can be attributed to the amount of talk they hear from birth through age 3.

1000 Books Before Kindergarten Program

Goal: read 1000 Books before your child reaches age 6 or starts school, whichever comes first.

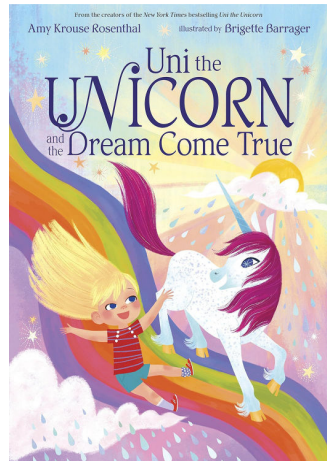
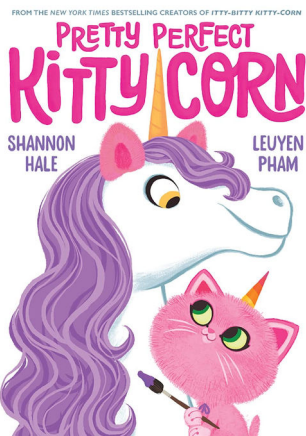
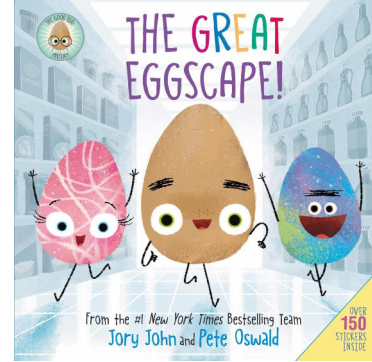
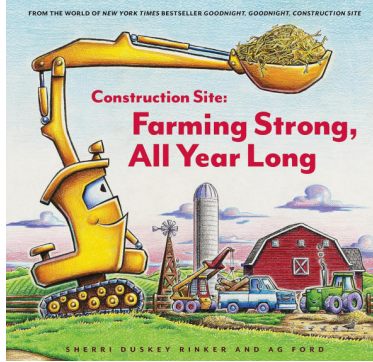
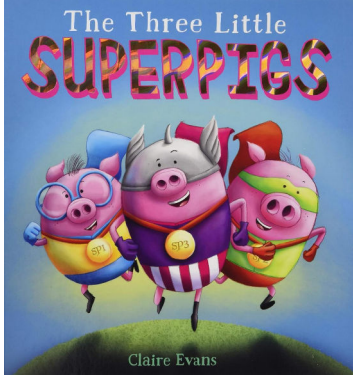
It's Easy!

- Read ANY book
- Read the same book over and over
- Read one book a night
= 365 books in a year
= 730 books in two years = 1,095 books in three years.

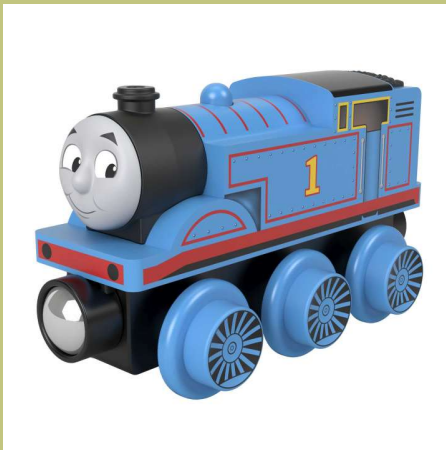
